André Saine, DC, ND, FCAH CE Credits: 2.0 Homeopathy, 1.0 General	A Common but Crucial Missing Step in Finding the Simillimum A great number of experienced Homeopathic Practitioners repeatedly make a crucial mistake in finding the simillimum, namely of not abiding to paragraphs 162 and 164 of Hahnemann's Organon. The key for success in Homeopathy is to find a remedy with a high degree of similarity. It is in this remedy that the genius of the disease must be found. This is especially important when treating patients with advanced or serious pathologies or "irremediably" progressive diseases. The greater the degree of similarity, the greater the patient's reaction to the remedy and the greater the healing response. To illustrate this point, Dr. Saine will present the case of a patient with a serious "incurable" disease for the attendees to resolve. Attendees are requested to bring their Repertories and Materia Medica for this presentation.

Dr. Gaby will describe his approach to evaluating and managing patients in his nutritional-medicine practice. Emphasis will be placed on how to perform a nutrition-oriented history and physical exam, and how to choose which dietary interventions, nutritional supplements, and other interventions are most likely to be effective for a particular patient.

Conventional medicine promotes highly aggressive treatments that can fail to deliver satisfactory treatment outcomes. In this intensive, research on the motives and demographics of cancer sufferers who seek naturopathic treatment is reviewed, together with the various alternative treatment options available. The main focus of the intensive is a review of the evidence for natural therapies, especially herbs, as adjuvant treatments for cancer, including the all-important issues of herb-drug and drug-nutrient interactions and interference with radiotherapy. Case histories are used to illustrate these topics. The intensive will conclude with a specific analysis of the role of natural treatments in prostate cancer.
